Who We Are

For over 90 years, UNH and its 37 members — independent community centers and settlement houses throughout New York City — have responded to the changing needs of New York City's communities, providing the services and programs that help children, families and adults lead productive and independent lives. Each year, UNH members — working at more than 400 sites with close to 10,000 staff members and 7,500 volunteers — provide the following:

Early Childhood and Family Support Programs for 20,000 infants, toddlers, young children, and their parents;

After School and Camp Programs for more than 50,000 school-age children;

Services for Older Adults (senior centers and other community and home-based services) for more than 60,000 older adults;

Education, Employment, Leadership and Recreation Programs for more than 60,000 teens;

Adult Education and Employment Programs for nearly 25,000 adults;

Services for Immigrants (civics classes, English for speakers of other languages, citizenship and legal assistance) for close to 14,000 immigrants;

Health Programs reaching nearly 200,000 individuals including:

- Education, screening, prevention and fitness programs; and
- Mental health and substance abuse counseling and treatment;

Arts Education and Performances reaching more than 100,000 children and adults;

Homelessness Prevention and Shelter Services for more than 30,000 individuals.

How We Work

INFLUENCING PUBLIC POLICY

UNH is a highly effective advocate on major policy and budget issues affecting New York City's low- and moderate-income communities. UNH works to improve policies and increase funding for child care, after school and teen programs, summer jobs for youth, English classes and immigrant services and supportive services for older adults. Policy makers turn to UNH for information and critical analysis based on the "real world experience" of UNH member agencies.

STRENGTHENING UNH MEMBERS

UNH identifies and responds to the current and emerging needs of its members for professional development, management assistance and other organizational support.

Through peer groups of UNH member staff, workshops and training sessions at UNH and in partnership with outside experts in non-profit management, UNH helps member agencies meet the challenges of providing services to their communities in an environment where competition for resources is fierce and the demand for programs is great.

SUPPORTING PROGRAM INNOVATION

Through a variety of special initiatives, UNH provides resources and technical assistance to strengthen the community based programs provided by UNH members. Recent projects have focused on parent engagement in settlement house programs, mental health services for older adults, promoting literacy through the arts and environmental education for young people in after school programs.

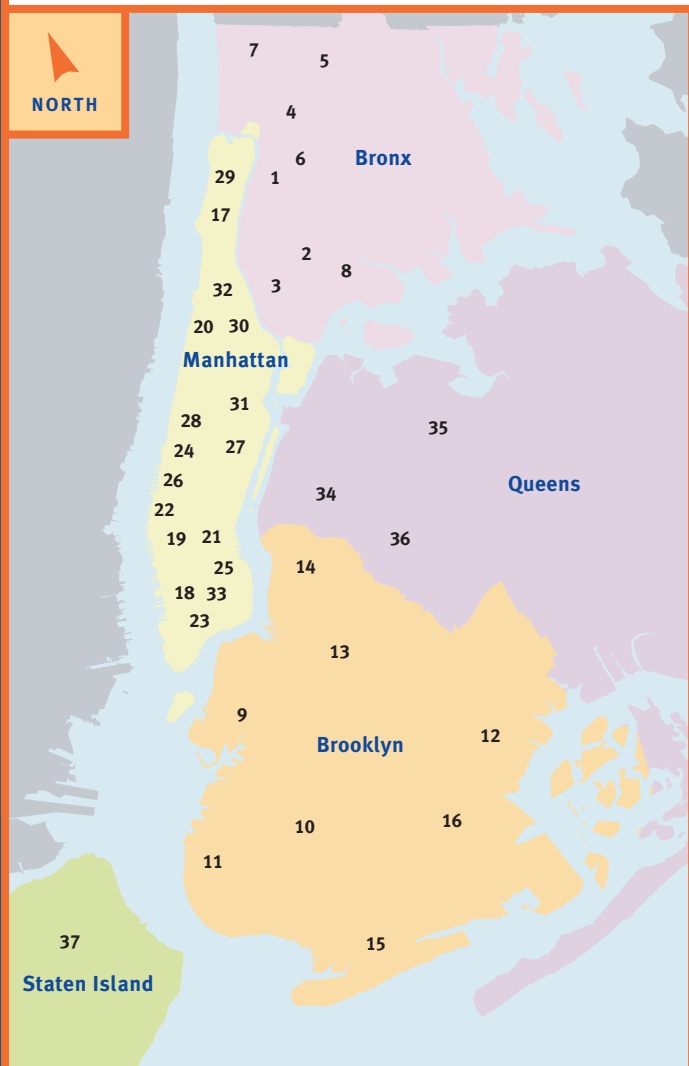
